

Prof. Izumi Ohno, Professor Emeritus, National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS), Japan



Izumi Ohno is Professor Emeritus and Adjunct Professor at the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS) in Japan, and Senior Research Advisor to the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) Ogata Sadako Research Institute for Peace and Development. She specializes in international development policy, industrial development cooperation, and business and development. She was GRIPS Professor during 2002-2024 and also served as Executive Director of JICA Ogata Research Institute during 2018-2020.

Prior to joining GRIPS, she worked at JICA, the World Bank, the Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund (OECF), and the Japan Bank for International Cooperation (JBIC). She holds an MPA from the Princeton School of Public and International Affairs at the Princeton University in USA.

She also served on a number of advisory committees in the areas of international development and inclusive business, including as Chair of the Advisory Panel to the Minister of Foreign Affairs on the Mobilization of New Funds for Development (2024). Since 2009, she has been engaged in JICA-supported intellectual cooperation, “Japan-Ethiopia industrial policy dialogue,” which aims to share the East Asian development experiences with senior policymakers in Ethiopia.

Her recent co-edited books include *Introducing Foreign Models for Development: Japanese Experience and Cooperation in the Age of New Technology* (2024, Springer) and *Industrial Human Resource Development in Developing Countries: Knowledge and Skills in the Era of SDGs* (2021, Nippon Hyoronsha).

She received Foreign Minister’s Commendation (promotion of international cooperation) in 2023 and the 12th JICA President Award in 2016.
