

Dorothy Yeboah-Manu, PhD:

Dorothy is a Professor of Microbiology, and the Director of Noguchi Memorial Institute for Medical Research (NMIMR), University of Ghana.

Her main research interest include Anti-Microbial Resistance, host-pathogen interactions, and genomic epidemiology of infectious diseases. She has extensive experience conducting sero-epidemiological surveys and one-health studies. Dorothy has more than 150 peer-reviewed articles in international journals, book chapters, edited books and has led several research grants worth millions of dollars.

She is a member/chair of several Advisory Boards and Committees including: a member of the Regional Technical Advisory Committee of Regional Coordinating Council of Africa CDC, Chairperson of the Advisory Board of the National TB Control Program, a Committee member of the Global Public Health Program of the American Society for Microbiology.

She is also a member of several consortia and professional bodies such as Vice President, Immunological Society, Ghana, West Africa Network of Excellence for TB, Malaria and HIV/AIDS (WANETAM) and the Pan-Africa Network for Genomic Surveillance of Poverty Related Diseases and Emerging Pathogens (PANGenS). She is a Senior Fellow of the European and Developing Countries Clinical Trials Partnership, a member of the Ghana Academy of Arts and Sciences. She is the recipient of the Royal Society Africa Prize 2018.
